Get off campus with SAC. The Student Activities Committee (SAC) offers a variety of off campus activities such as going to the movies, bowling, and more. Transportation is often included or offered so it does not matter if you have a car on campus or not.

appointments within their office hours to cut down on wait times, but others will have you do 'drop-in' visits where you can drop-in at any point during their office hours to chat or ask questions.

Turn off your phone. Whether you are studying at the library or in class, having your phone buzzing can get distracting. Try putting your phone on Do Not Disturb or on driving mode. Driving mode is available on some devices and is similar to Do Not Disturb, however it allows you to send an automated custom message to those that text you saying that you are driving, or in this case, studying. The library even offers lock boxes at the front desk for students to take and set a timer on while they are studying.

Explore how to study. There are tons of study tips on the internet (and on the Cosmos website) and they all pretend to be the perfect fit for every student. The fact is that different study strategies work for different people and different classes. The way that you study for Chemistry may not work for your Spanish class, so take some

solo study sessions and the basement is great for group projects and tutoring.

How to...

Coe Dining and Services

Dining Services: The main dining hall has a lot of features that may seem overwhelming at first glance. The first thing you need to know is that you need your student ID to scan in for meal swipes or money to pay for a meal. You can also choose to eat your food in the dining hall or take it in a to-go box. Beyond that you can eat at as many or as few of the stations as you wish. Here is a simple breakdown of what each station has to offer:

Simple Servings has allergen free options open M-F with the possibility of weekend availability if enough students express the interest. To prevent cross-contamination and promote food safety, a staff member will plate your food at this station for you with whatever you would like.

The Grill rotates through a wide variety of entrees such as sandwiches, hot dogs, hamburgers, grilled cheese, and more, as well as sides like French fries.

The Sandwich Station has a variety of bread options to choose from and many proteins and veggies to add to your sandwich. A staff member will build your sandwich for you per your instructions.

The Main Line rotates through a variety of homestyle meals and sides, however the attached pizza and pasta station remain the same daily.

The Salad Bar has two mixes of greens available with a variety of add-ins and dressings.

KoGo Marketplace is located in Lower Gage, next to the Intercultural Center. Students can buy Coe merch and clothing here, however, you cannot use Coe Cash for merchandise or clothing.

Common Grounds is located on the main floor of the library and serves Starbucks products! Coe Cash can be used here.

Resources: There are many resources available to you as a Coe student, below are just a few.

The Nest Food Pantry: Located in Upper Gage between the men's restroom and the reflection room. Just tap your ID on the reader and open the door to free food and toiletry items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, and other similar items). The Nest is open to student use and access 24/7 with the scan of your student

Writing Center: Located on the main floor of the library at the back. Schedule an appointment (coe.mywconline. com) or on a walk-in basis. The Writing Center student employees can work with students at any stage in the process of writing. They also have free hot beverages and candy for those that stop by, but make sure to bring your own cup to your appointment.

Speak Out

Consultants: Located on the main floor of the library at the back. Much like the Writing Center, the Speak Out Consultants can help polish oral presentations. Schedule an appointment at coe. mywconline.com






